





Our mission and activities









A daily contribution to a fair, inclusive and sustainable European food supply chain



The general environment over the past 5 years has changed considerably, both in terms of **legislative framework** and **awareness attitude** from all the actors of the food supply chain, public administrations, civil society organisations, and consumers.

From 2016 to 2020, the **quantity of food recovered** and redistributed from FEBA members in 29 European countries has **increased of almost 60%.**

Looking at the future: FEBA recommendations





Foster the implementation of EU instruments and policies such as the EU guidelines on food donation, Key Recommendations for Action in food waste prevention and the Farm to Fork Strategy



Encourage governments to **strengthen national legislative frameworks** that support and facilitate food donation and the redistribution of surplus food for human consumption



Develop and implement **integrated urban food system policies** where Food Banks are pivotal in the context of pressing socio-ecological challenges, from poverty and pandemics to climate change



Support and promote the **digitalisation and innovation of Food Banks** to accelerate the transition to a sustainable food system



Increase awareness regarding the role played by Food Banks as an integral part of the food system, promoting social cohesion and wellbeing as well as the fight against climate change
